WHAT IS DISTRICT 10 4-H ROUNDUP?

The District 10 4-H Roundup event is held twice a year (Fall & Spring) to allow 4-H members to showcase their knowledge and talents in various 4-H contests. District 10 4-H members of all age divisions are welcome to compete in any of the contests offered (granted they meet the criteria of the event). The following information below applies to all Spring Roundup District contests, unless otherwise stated in the contest's specific rules. MEMBERSHIP & AGE DIVISIONS

Participants must be 4-H members currently <u>enrolled</u> on 4HOnline and belong to a Texas 4-H Youth Development County program.

There are three age divisions for competition as outlined below. 4-H members' division is determined by their grade level by Aug. 31, 2024.

- Junior: 8 yrs. old & in 3rd 5th
- Intermediate: Grades 6th 8th
- Senior: Grades 9th 12th (& not surpassed 18 yrs.)
- *<u>Smallbore Rile ONLY</u> has modified age divisions. Please check contest rules.

Note: Juniors may move up to the Intermediate age division when participating on an intermediate team. Intermediates/Seniors may NOT move up or down to a different age division.

2025 Texas 4-H Horse Validation March 1st – May 1st: Validation Entry Period on 4HOnline May 2nd - 5th : LATE Validation Period (\$250 per horse)



INFORMATION: 4-H exhibitors wishing to participate in the 2025 State Horse show must validate any horses that will be used in the competition. ALL horses must be validated/re-validated each year. There is no limit to the number of horses that can be validated. You are encouraged to validate all horses that may possibly be shown at the State Horse Show in July. Only state validated horses can be substituted in the event that a validated horse becomes unusable due to lameness, sickness, etc.

VALIDATION ENTRY PERIODS & FEES

Families can submit payment by credit card ONLY.

- From March 1 April 15, the validation cost for each horse is \$10.00. The \$10.00 cost is only guaranteed if the animal validation is approved by the county office by the April 15th deadline and the payment is processed.
- From April 16 May 1, the validation cost for each horse is \$20.00. The \$20.00 cost is only guaranteed if the animal validation is approved by the county office by the May 1st deadline and the payment is processed.
- From May 2-5, the validation cost for each horse is \$250.00.

HOW TO VALIDATE YOUR HORSE:

Horse Validation will take place on 4HOnline. The family will receive an automated message from 4-H Online when the County Extension Agent has approved the horse at the county level. **This approval does NOT guarantee eligibility**. After it is approved at the county level, the validation will then be reviewed at the state level. <u>The family will be notified by June 1st if there are any issues with the validation at the state level</u>. The state will review validations at the state level on March 1st and will be working closely with families & agents to fix errors as quickly as possible prior to the deadline.

VALIDATION INSTRUCTIONS:

- Each validation must include front view, right side view, and left side view images. The entire horse should be included in the photo and markings should be clearly visible.
- If the horse is registered, a copy of the registration papers must be uploaded. These papers must list the 4-Her, sibling, parent, stepparent, grandparent or legal guardian as the current owner. If the ownership is in the process of being transferred, please list "pending" in the registration number area. Once the updated registration papers have been received, please deliver a new copy to your County Office.
- Image uploads in 4-H Online must be in the form of a .jpg, .gif or .png file.
- Families should validate each horse only one time. Once the horse is validated, any sibling within that family in 4-H Online is eligible to show the horse at the State 4-H Horse Show.
- Youth validating a futurity horse must be at least 12 years of age (as of Sept. 1, 2024) and at least in the 6th grade.

LEASE HORSES:

Lease horses are eligible to be validated and shown at the State 4-H Horse Show. An official Texas 4-H Horse Lease Agreement must be signed by the exhibitor, horse owner, and the supervising County Agent. The lease period must include, at minimum, May 1st to August 31st of the current 4-H year. The lease agreement form can be found <u>HERE</u> or on <u>https://texasyouthlivestock.com/horse-validation/</u> and must be uploaded in 4-H Online at the time of validation.




